

Do I have a Thyroid Nodule?

You may have a thyroid nodule problem if you have:

- A lump or swelling at the base of your neck. This lump is often asymptomatic but may also cause pain
- Difficulty swallowing or breathing
- A Swollen neck
- Hoarseness



Consultation.

Prior to your first visit, you will receive a questionnaire requesting some information about your medical history to help us prepare for your consultation. Some patients may be requested to get blood work done prior to the consultation.

On your first visit, you will be seen by a team of physicians – an endocrinologist, a surgeon, and a pathologist – who will conduct a thorough evaluation of your condition. You will receive an ultrasound scan and fine-needle biopsy of the thyroid nodules on-site. If blood work was not previously taken, it can be done on the same day.

Diagnosis.

It will take 7 days to receive the results of your biopsy, at which point a report will be sent to you and your referring physician. If your results indicate a non-cancerous nodule, the endocrinologist will recommend a course of treatment.

Should your results be unclear or signal a more serious condition, your case will be brought before a thyroid tumor board. This monthly meeting of thyroid experts will discuss your case and agree upon a recommended course of action.

Treatment.

Our team of specialists will work with you throughout the course of your treatment. Should you require surgery, our experienced surgeons are adept in the most current technological advances. After surgery, our endocrinologists will work closely with your referring doctor to monitor your condition. If you need radioactive iodine treatment after surgery, this will also be coordinated.

It is recommended that you consult with your general physician before booking an appointment at the Thyroid Center to first rule out other possibilities and determine whether there is sufficient need to see a thyroid specialist.
